# Men's First Team Bassett Bulletin

## Welcome To Today's Game

**GOOD AFTERNOON** and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League Premier Division fixture against Pershore Town. A warm welcome to all our visitors who have made the journey from Worcestershire, we hope you enjoy your short stay with us this afternoon and we wish you a safe journey home.

Pershore are having a great first season in the Premier Division and currently sit in fifth place in the table following a big 8-1 win over bottom of the table Wantage Town on Tuesday night. They were 3-2 winners when we met at their place back in September and a brief report on that game is included in today's programme. We know we are going to be in for a tough game here this afternoon as we look to protect the only unbeaten home record in the Premier Division of the UHlsport Hellenic League.

After the drama and disappointment of Saturday's FA Vase game, Sam and the lads bounced back immediately from that defeat with a 2-1 win over Clanfield 85 in the Wiseman Floodlit Cup on Tuesday night. We are now through to the quarter final stage of that competition where we will be joined by Abingdon United, Roman Glass St George, Brimscombe & Thrupp and Oxford City Development. Three ties have still to be played and today's visitors are still in the cup along with the two Worcester sides, City and Raiders. The draw has already been made and we will be away to Roman Glass St George at the end of January. Having lost to Roman Glass in the League Challenge Cup already this season we will hopefully avenge that earlier cup defeat when we meet Roman Glass again in January. I note we are then set to meet Roman Glass St George again in the league just three days later.

This is the third programme required in the space of a week and it has been one programme too far really. I always hate it when we have three home games in such a short space of time and it has been

something of a struggle to pull this one together.

Yet another home game next Saturday as well when Lydney Town visit the Sustain Stadium for another league game. This is followed by a trip to Longlevens before the big local derby against Highworth Town the day after Boxing Day.

The Development Team are back in action on today when they entertain Pewsey Vale on the 3G in a league fixture in the Corsham Print Wiltshire Senior League. We lost 4-2 back in September and Mark and the lads will be keen to avenge that defeat and I know Pewsey do not like playing on the 3G.

The Women's team have an important league fixture this weekend, away to Stockwood Wanderers who sit just above Bassett in the table. This is another must win game for Adam Wood's side if they are to bounce back from last season's relegation at the first attempt.

The U18 team saw their scheduled game against Bradford Town postponed on Thursday night with Bradford Town having now pulled out of the league due to players not making themselves available for fixtures. Bassett, unlike some of the U18 sides, are up with their fixtures and currently sit second in the table. The U18's had a good result the previous Thursday here at the GBSG becoming the first side this season to take points off the league leaders Bristol Manor Farm following a 1-1 draw. Unfortunately there were some unsavoury incidents at the end of the game which are now being handled by the FA.

Enjoy the game and hopefully we will be celebrating progress to the next round of this midweek cup competition to keep our season alive on three fronts.

# Collier honoured following 350th game



Ahead of Saturday's FA Vase fixture, Sam Collier was presented with a bottle of champagne by chairman Paul Gerrish in recognition of his 350th game with the club as either player or manager - a milestone reached in last week's Hellenic League Premier Division win away at Westfields.

Collier initially joined Bassett as a player in the summer of 2009. Starting out as a defender, Collier struggled to get to grips with the pace and tenacity of attackers in Hellenic League Division One West and was relegated to the bench for a September visit to Harrow Hill. However that evening would change the course of his career as, in manager Dave Turner's

hour of need, Collier came on as a striker, scoring twice in a 3-1 win.

He would play as a forward for the rest of the season, firing 22 goals in all as Bassett finished as runners-up and earned promotion back to the Hellenic Premier. The following season Collier was again Bassett's top scorer with an impressive 26 goal haul.

While Bassett finished 15th, ground grading issues meant they were demoted back to Division One West for 2011-12. Collier initially stuck around with Bassett while also having a brief spell back with Bassett under Jeff Roberts in 2013-14.

But the lure of Southern League football was too tempting and he had successful stops at step four with Abingdon United, Cirencester Town and Wantage Town, while also serving briefly as player-manager at Shrivenham after close friend Dave Turner tragically passed away.

Collier returned for good in 2017-18. His eleven goals that year were enough to finish as top scorer a third time, while he also took over the reins as interim manager in January 2018 after the departure of Rich Hunter.

A slow start saw Bassett winless in his first nine matches in charge. But Collier scored the only goal of the game to break his managerial duck against Ascot United. Bassett would end the season 15th with Collier doing enough to be appointed on a permanent basis.

Collier would improve on that in his first full season in charge in 2018-19, guiding his team to tenth place - at that point the club's highest ever finish.

Covid interrupted the following two seasons, but that did not prevent Bassett having cup success. Bassett equalled their best FA Cup and Vase runs in 2020-21 and also reached the Hellenic League Challenge Cup semi finals that season. In the FA Cup upset wins over Didcot Town and Cinderford Town helped Bassett reach the second qualifying round where they lost narrowly to National League South Oxford City, while in the Vase the team advanced to the second round.

More cup success followed in 2021-22. The first full post-pandemic season, Bassett finished 12th in the league and advanced to the FA Vase third round for the first time ever thanks to wins against Knaphill, Portishead Town, Downton and Torpoint Athletic.

2022-23 was then Collier's best season yet as manager. After a run to the FA Cup first qualifying round, Bassett again reached the Vase third round before finishing fifth - higher than ever before - in the Hellenic Premier. His team also advanced to the Hellenic League Challenge Cup semi finals for a second time.

So far this season - in which Collier reached the 350 game mark - Bassett have again performed strongly in the league and are in the hunt for another top five placing, which this year would mean entering the promotion playoffs. Bassett, of course, made the Vase third round again though another record was sadly just out of reach with defeat on penalties against Bridgwater United.

71 goals (and one last minute penalty save as a stand in goalkeeper) in 161 games and one promotion as a player, cup and league records as a manager: Collier has been not just a loyal, but a successful servant of the club.

The next milestone for him is 400 games. Hopefully by then there will be some silverware - in the form of the Wiltshire Premier Shield or Hellenic League Floodlit Cup - or possibly even another promotion to add to his list of achievements with Bassett.

# Opponents History

## Pershore Town

Pershore Town Football Club was formed on the back of three local clubs; Pershore United, Pershore Rec. Rovers and a junior club, Pershore Bullets, getting together to form a club that could play in a better standard of football and to improve the facilities at King George IV Playing Fields.

The new club, Pershore Town 88 FC, joined the Midland Football Combination in 1989, initially in Division Two, where they were champions at the first attempt with just four league defeats all season to their record - finishing eleven points clear under the guidance of the clubs first manager, John Judge.

The following season, in Midland Combination Division One, Pershore Town would finish third with seventeen wins from twenty eight games. The club was promoted by the League Management Committee to the Premier Division for the 1991/92 season.

Ahead of the 1991/92 season, John Judge stood down from the managerial role and Colin Shephard was appointed First Team Manager.

Off the field, the clubs commitment to improving facilities remained true; a new function room "Abbey Suite" that was able to cater for 120 people was built, whilst a 140 all seater stand was also added to the Kings George IV Playing Field.

Two top half finishes would follow until the 1993/94 season where the club were crowned champions with twenty five wins in forty two games, a 2 - 1 away win over Meir KA on the last day of the season, capturing the league title.

□□The same season, Pershore Town recorded their best run in the FA Cup, entering for the first time, by reaching the fourth qualifying round, beating Racing Club Warwick, Northampton Spencer, Pelsall Villa and Atherstone United before Yeading proved one step to far.

The Atherstone United fixture will live long in the history of the football club, a victory in front of the BBC cameras and a then club record attendance of 730. The club were also previewed on both the BBC's "Road To Wembley" and on Central News.

During these formative years, the club also won the Robert Biggart Memorial Cup, and incredible three times, the Worcestershire Junior Cup and the Jack Mould Cup - alongside this, being runners-up in the Worcestershire Senior Urn.

Following the league win, Pershore Town would become one of the founder members of the Midland Football Alliance - the top ten teams from both the Midland Combination Premier Division and the West Midland Premier League created this league.

Whilst the club finished in the bottom half during the next two seasons, periods of success were enjoyed at one point in the 1995/96 season, Pershore Town were third in the division. Nevertheless, the club found the step up tough.

Progress in the league wasn't easy for Pershore, however during that 1995/96 season the club made tremendous progress in the FA Vase, reaching the third round proper. Away wins over Knowle, West Midlands Police and Nettleham were recorded before a trip to Burgess Hill Town would prove to be the clubs undoing, going down 2 - 1.

A bottom placed finish during the 1996/97 season, but no relegation, was backed up by finishing second from bottom the following two seasons.

In 1998, Pershore Town added another club to it's merger with Worcester Athletico absorbed. Worcester themselves had an impressive record in a brief stay in the Midland Combination, winning the Premier Division during the 1997/98 season.

# Opponents History

## Pershore Town

Pershore's stay in the Midland Alliance would come to an end following the 1999/00 season however, finishing bottom of twenty two teams with just seven wins from forty two games and conceding one hundred and three goals. After several managerial changes over a six year period, the club were relegated back to the Midland Combination Premier.

The following two seasons looked to be positive for Pershore, a fourth placed finish followed by a sixth place finish - it was hoped that the fortunes of the football club were going to swing back in their favour.

Nevertheless, the next five seasons would see Pershore Town finish in the bottom half of the Midland Combination Premier. Whilst the 2007/08 season showed a little revival, an eighth placed finish which could've been joint fifth but for the deduction of three points.

Whilst the league was a constant struggle for Pershore Town, during the 2013/14 season the club did win the Worcester Royal Infirmary Cup, beating Malvern Town 2 - 1. Phil Marsh converted from the penalty spot whilst veteran substitute Richard Congrave scored the winner.

By the 2014/15 season, the Midland Alliance and Midland Combination had merged to create the Midland Football League, Pershore were placed in Division One. After a poor start to the campaign, a managerial change brought about a better style of football and results began to improve. By March, the team had won MFL March Team of the Month and eventually went on to finish in its highest position for several years.

A disappointing start to the following season would again see a managerial change, with former Wolves and Hereford United player Quentin Townsend taking charge.

Ahead of the 2018/19 season, Pershore Town were moved from the Midland Football

League and joined the West Midland (Regional) League Premier Division, finishing 14th in their first season before the next two were abandoned for COVID-19.

A league move wasn't the only change at Pershore Town, former Malvern Town manager Les Jones was appointed First Team Manager along with Derek Doyle as his Assistant Manager.

Les stood down from his role as First Team Manager during the 2020/21 season, Stewart Watkins was his replacement whilst Les took on the role as Director of Football.

By December 2020, Neil Parton, former Worcester City Reserve Team manager, was challenged with the role of pushing Pershore Town forwards.

With the league restructure, Pershore Town were moved from the West Midland Regional League to the Hellenic League ahead of the 2021/22 season.

During the 2021/22 season and following a poor start, Neil was replaced in November with former Pershore Town player, Danny Janes. Janes joined the club from fellow Hellenic League side, FC Stratford - a club he had taken to the top of the league before returning to the Community Stadium. Table.

Season 2022/23 was to prove to be a successful one for Pershore Town as they finished as champions of Division 1 of the UHlsport Hellenic League, finishing some ten points ahead of second placed Hartpury University. This title success saw them promoted to the Premier Division for Season 2023/24. They have had a good start to their first season in the Premier Division and currently sit in fifth place in the league table.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town came back from 2-0 down only to lose by the odd goal in five as their first ever visit to Pershore Town ended in defeat.

Bassett looked in deep trouble at half time as they trailed 2-0 following a Josh Willis double. However, goals from Tommy Ouldrige and Adam Corcoran pulled Bassett level with twenty minutes to go. Sam Collier's side were then denied what earlier would have seemed an unlikely point when Matt Nutt scored what proved to be the winner with six minutes left.

Willis gave his side the lead shortly after the quarter hour mark, coolly placing a penalty past Harry Pickering into the bottom corner of the net after Aidan Clark had been brought down.

He then doubled Pershore's lead with a wonder goal on 30 minutes, seeing Pickering off his line before scoring a stunning lobbed effort from range.

The Plums were therefore well in control with a bruised Bassett left to stew at half time.

But rather than crumble, Sam Collier's side fought back valiantly.

A defensive error shortly after the restart allowed them to get back into the match as Tommy Ouldrige pounced on a gift from the hosts before doing well to finish from an acute angle.

It took some time for the equaliser to come, but when it did it duly arrived in emphatic style. A corner was allowed to bounce in the box and the ball rose perfectly for captain Adam Corcoran who swivelled and rifled a powerful half volley into the back of the net.

However, having fought their way back onto level terms, Bassett soon found themselves behind once more though as a cross wasn't dealt with and Matt Nutt slotted home.

Pershore were then able to see out the match as Bassett fell to a third league defeat of the season.

### A Bridge too far again as Bassett suffer sudden death agony

After In each of the last three seasons Royal Wootton Bassett Town have enjoyed record-setting (and subsequently record-equalling) runs to the FA Vase third round. Alas, in each of those years, Bassett have gone no further.

After heartbreak against Hamworthy United and penalties pain against Corsham Town, Bassett can add to that list a gut wrenching 6-5 sudden death shootout defeat against Bridgwater United, the Somerset side triumphing on a misty December afternoon at the Sustain Stadium after a dramatic game ended 2-2 after 90 minutes.

In fairness, to Bassett the draw at this stage of the competition for three consecutive years has not been especially kind. While having home advantage for each game, Sam Collier and his team have encountered - and ultimately come up short - against three of the best step five sides the south west has to offer. Hamworthy and Corsham both went on to reach the Vase semi finals, with the Hammers also claiming the Wessex League title and Corsham narrowly missing out on a promotion playoff appearance.

Bridgwater, despite the recent turmoil surrounding the controversial sacking of long-serving manager Dave Pearse, were of the same mould. The Robins - flying high in the Western League Premier Division - had reached at least the Vase fourth round three seasons running, with a fifth round appearance last year.



The tie was therefore never going to be easy.

Again Bassett were resolute. They gave everything they had and showed they can compete with the best teams this level of football has to offer. Again, however, Bassett narrowly lacked the formula - or the slice of luck - needed to get past their opponents.

The better team on this day, Bridgwater therefore extended their fourth round streak to four years - albeit after an almighty battle.

Bassett had led after just ten minutes. Captain Adam Corcoran delivered the goods, wrong-footing Isaac Finch in the Bridgwater goal by deflecting Louis Spalding's right-footed shot into the net after the visitors had only half cleared from a corner.

After going behind Bridgwater quickly got on top. But despite having lots of possession, they failed to eke out many real opportunities as Bassett's defence held firm.

They did come awfully close to an equaliser when Harry Horton's header rattled the post, with Rob Brown pulling off a fine reaction save to prevent the ball diverting in.

George King also fired narrowly over with a firm drive from outside the area, while the impressive Jay Murray shot just over from an acute angle.

Bridgwater's pressure eventually paid off though as Bassett's resistance was broken on the stroke of half time when Horton's powerful effort from the edge of the box flew past Brown.

Having scored just before the break, Bridgwater then went ahead immediately after the restart as King thumped in from similar range to Horton.



Bassett almost generated a quick reply though Finch was equal to a Sam Packer header after he rose to meet Bailey Gallagher's cross.

Forced to chase an equaliser, the game opened up and the teams exchanged chances as the second half progressed.

Tom Llewellyn struck just wide of the post from range for the visitors before Bridgwater were fortunate an Alfie Presley drive struck the back of a defender, veering out of harm's way. Jason Quick then headed over, while Connor Waldon placed wide.

Time appeared as it was not going to be on Bassett's side. But in injury time salvation arrived, the hosts' efforts to get back on terms rewarded when substitute Alan Griffin bundled in a header from a corner.



That meant spot kicks - and, if the crowd thought the drama was done for the day they were mistaken.

Penalties started in a relatively routine manner as Scott Chilcott and Ben Griffiths both converted.



But Finch then saved from Griffin and Tom Llewellyn scored to give Bridgwater an early break.

Bailey Gallagher and Jack Thorne put away their teams' third round of kicks before Jack Hobson-McVeigh scored to open up the fourth.

With time running out though, Bassett still needed a stop to get back on terms - and they got it as Brown denied Jake Llewellyn.

Alfie Presley and Murray then kept their nerve, forcing sudden death.

It didn't start well for Bassett though as Tommy Ouldrige ballooned his kick over the bar - but Brown bailed his team out, saving from Morgan Williams.

After Connor Waldon and Horton were successful it was then Finch's turn to play hero, keeping out Jowan Partridge's effort.

Quick then stepped up for his team's second match point and - breaking Bassett's hearts - he found the net.

Another year, another successful Vase run. But, once more, the third round proves Bassett's stumbling block.

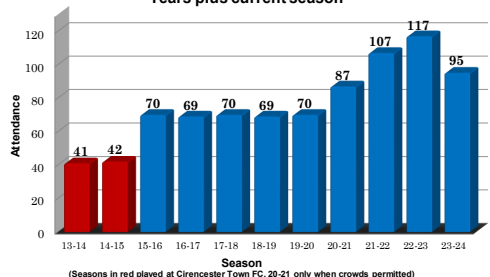

AND THEN there were three. Maybe six.

The FA Cup third round proper is fast approaching and Non-League will be represented by at least a trio of clubs — you wouldn't bet against it being more.

Maidstone United were the first to confirm their place last Saturday afternoon and it with the typical heartwarming FA Cup story of academy graduate turned hero with Bivesh Gurung's brilliant strike lighting up the Gallagher Stadium as the Stones beat League Two Barrow.

It's their first trip to third round stage of the competition since reforming in 1992 and manager George Elokobi was, almost, lost for words.

The third round draw perhaps hasn't provided the big Premier League giant any Non-League club would be hoping for. But it has provided opportunity.

On Sunday afternoon it was the turn of Eastleigh and Chesterfield.

The latter are threatening to run away with the National League title and they've shown what a good side they are by dumping out two League One sides in the last two rounds.

After the scalp of Portsmouth came the 1-0 upset of Leyton Orient. Paul Cook's side travel to Championship club Watford next.

There aren't many better inside National

League boxes than Paul McCallum and the Eastleigh forward bagged two as Richard Hill's Spitfires beat Reading on live telly.

Like in so many dramatic upsets, the winner came deep in stoppage-time and gave the League One Royals — beset by problems off the the pitch — no time to come back.

Their third round opposition is still TBC. Could we be set for a National League showdown? If Barnet, who scored a late equaliser at Newport County through Danny Collinge, click again in Tuesday's replay then they are going to cause problems for the League Two side. Bees v Spitfires would be huge in round three. We'll see.

As we will for National League North Alfreton Town. They had the disappointment last Saturday of their live TV game with Walsall being postponed just minutes before kick-off because of a frozen pitch.

They tried again on Tuesday night and shared a 0-0 draw so it's back to the League Two outfit for the right to play Southampton away.

A trip to a Championship club is also on offer for Aldershot Town when they face Stockport County again following a 2-2 draw at home — Josh Stokes, a summer signing from AFC Sudbury, continued to show why he's one of Non-League's most talked about talents with two goals.

Three in round three has a nice ring to it. But we'd prefer six. Good luck everyone!
