# Men's First Team Bassett Bulletin

## Welcome To Tonight's Game

### **GOOD AFTERNOON, HAPPY NEW YEAR**

and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this UHlsport Hellenic League game against Cinderford Town for what is the first league meeting between the sides at our home venue. A warm welcome to all our visitors who have made the journey from Gloucestershire for the game, we hope you enjoy your short stay with us this afternoon.

Cinderford currently sit in 10th place in the table but have games in hand over all the teams above them in the table, including ourselves. The two teams have met on just the one occasion previously, that meeting coming in the FA Cup when Cinderford were in the Southern League in Season 2020-21. That day it finished all square at 2-2 meaning penalties were needed to settle matters and we came out on top that day. Hopefully we can secure another victory here this afternoon to maintain our push for the play-offs but it will be another tough game in what is turning out to be a very competitive Premier Division this season.

Since the last programme notes there are four games to report back on in what has been a very successful festive period with three impressive away wins, the only minor blip on our festive round of matches being the home defeat to local rivals Highworth Town. The visit to Longlevens just before Christmas saw us return with all three points courtesy of a 2-0 win. We then had that game with Highworth the day after Boxing Day which attracted our biggest gate of the season so far, although the upcoming games against Worcester City and Corsham Town are both likely to see larger crowds. Highworth were deserved 3-1 winners on the night when it really didn't happen for us. Those sort of games occur every now and then and it is how you respond to such a defeat that is important. In the case of Sam and the lads that response has been superb, two away trips to Hereford either side of New Year and retuning with six points in the bag to consolidate our third placed position in the table. Roman Glass could have dislodged us from that third spot in midweek but they fell to a 4-2 defeat against the new league leaders

Worcester City. With players returning from suspension and with a couple of new signings we look set for a good final third of the season.

The Development Team have had just the one game before Christmas to report back on and that was an impressive 4-4 draw against title chasing Kintbury Rangers. A report on that game and all the four first team fixtures is included in this afternoon's programme.

It is with great sadness that I have to report that the county of Wiltshire has lost one of its greatest football ambassadors with the sad passing of Dennis Kilford on New Year's Eve after a short illness. Dennis had been with the Wiltshire Senior League since its inception in 1976, becoming Vice Chairman in 1983 before being elected as Chairman in 1991. He became President in 2006 before standing down in 2016. Prior to his roles on the Senior League, Dennis played for the very successful Swindon Victoria side before becoming a referee. He was a great sounding board to me personally when I joined the league committee and he took an avid interest in compiling the history section of the League website. I was honoured when Dennis entrusted me with reporter Harry Beattie's old league handbooks dating back to just after the Second World War, in which Harry had recorded most results across the county, not only in the old Wiltshire League but also the various cup competitions across the county covering all the leagues. Dennis' experience, knowledge and advice will be sorely missed by the football community in Wiltshire and our thoughts are with his family and friends at this sad time.

January is certainly set to be a busy month with even first team fixtures, including a Wiltshire Premier Shield tie against Swindon Supermarine on Tuesday night. There is a preview of that game in today's programme.

Enjoy the match and hopefully we will be celebrating three vital points to maintain our push for the play-offs and to keep us in touch with the top two in the table.

# Opponents History

## Cinderford Town

Cinderford Town was formed in 1922 and played in the Glos Northern Senior League until 1939. In that year they joined the newly formed Bristol Charity League, but this folded two weeks later at the outbreak of World War Two. They then joined the Western League Division 2, and in 1957 won the title. During the two seasons they spent in the top flight, they set a ground attendance record, when a home game with Minehead saw 4,850 people in attendance. Sadly, participation at this level put severe financial pressure on the Club, who were then forced to withdraw and return to the Glos Northern Senior League.

Three years later, the Club made the unusual decision to join the Warwickshire Combination, and won a League and Cup double in 1964, which saw them step up to the West Midlands (Regional) League. A very strong league at the time, with member clubs such as Kidderminster Harriers, Boston United, Tamworth and Hednesford. 1968-69 season was their last at this level, but they bowed out as Joint League Cup winners with Kidderminster. Both Clubs shared the Trophy for 6 months.

Cinderford returned to play in the newly formed Gloucestershire County League for the 1969-70 season and stayed for the next 5 years, finishing as runners-up on 3 occasions. They again sought a higher standard of football, and were accepted into the Midland Combination. Town played in this League for the next 10 seasons, achieving a best finish of 4th and also winning the League Cup, before being forced to return to the Glos County League following financial problems relating to the Social Club. A new Committee stabilised the Club, so much so that floodlights were purchased outright, and in the 1990-91 season, the Club gained admission to the Hellenic League, initially in Division 1, where they won the title at the first attempt. Four years later, the Club claimed an historic first by winning the Premier Division title, the League Cup and the Hellenic Floodlight Cup, and stepped up to the Southern League, where they remain today with 28 years unbroken membership. The 1995-96 season saw

Cinderford embark on an incredible F A Cup run, beating 2 Conference Clubs to reach the Second Round Proper, holding Gravesend & Northfleet to a 1-1 home draw before losing 3-0 in the replay in Kent. The winners were drawn with Aston Villa in the Third Round.

In the 2015-16 season, Cinderford were Champions of Southern League Div 1, South & West, but initially rejected promotion when undisclosed debts were discovered. However they accepted promotion following a series of appeals which affected the constitution of the League going into the new season. The Club were duly relegated in their first season in the Premier Division, returning to play in the Southern League First Division again.

Under the then leadership of Manager Paul Michael, the Club went from strength to strength, with a League Cup Final appearance, losing to a single goal at Premier Division side Stratford Town, and reaching a League play-off final, losing away at Yate Town, who persuaded Paul to join them for their promotion to the Premier Division.

Former Bishops Cleeve Manager Steve Cleal was appointed to replace Paul Michael but after an unsuccessful spell, he was succeeded as Manager by Alex Sykes, the former Gloucester City and Forest Green player, who was also unable to improve matters on the pitch.

After an incredible 28 consecutive seasons as members of the Southern League, the Club were relegated at the end of the 2022-2023 season, to rejoin the Hellenic League Premier Division.

Alex Sykes left the Club by mutual consent, and has been replaced by former Merthyr Town player and former Manager at Welsh Club Aberargoed, Matt Driscoll, who has had the unenviable task of rebuilding the entire squad. Hopes are high for a successful return to the Hellenic League, and eventual return back to the Southern League.

# Last Meeting v Cinderford Town



## Tuesday 22 September 2020 Comeback kings spot on for another Cup-set Cinderford Town 2 Royal Wootton Bassett Town 2 (Won 6-5 on pens)

Not content with just one shock Emirates FA Cup victory this season, Royal Wootton Bassett Town produced another upset as they defeated Cinderford Town on penalties after a stirring comeback against the Southern League Division One South side.

Despite another excellent performance in which they took the game to their higher-level opponents, Sam Collier's side found themselves 2-0 down after 50 minutes and staring at a First Qualifying Round exit.

But Bassett summoned everything they had in reserve to claw their way back into the tie. Goals from TJ Bohane and, in the last minute, youngster Jack Baker ultimately restored parity. And that forced penalties where a half dozen perfect spot kicks and a Harrison Ellis save earned a 6-5 sudden death triumph.

As with the win over Didcot Town in the previous round, the outcome was more than fair. Neither victory was of the smash and grab or fortuitous variety. And Collier's troops now find themselves in the hat for the FA Cup Second Qualifying Round - a feat matching Bassett's best ever run in this famous competition, achieved in 2012-13 when the late Dave Turner, a close friend of the current Bassett boss, was in charge.

How Bassett have got there has been thoroughly impressive.

Playing in familiar surroundings, Cinderford enjoyed the better of the immediate opening exchanges, with Zak Drew creating a pair of good openings, one of which forced a decent save from Ellis.

However, when Cinderford took the lead midway through the first half, Rhys Davies steering in after a low cross from the right into

the box, they did so somewhat against the run of play.

The home side were instead happy just to sit back and try and hit Bassett on the break. And the visitors were arguably the better team, though lacked a quality ball in the final third "something which wasn't helped by the enforced withdrawal through injury of the returning Brad Pagliaroli seven minutes before the interval.

Even though they went into the break a goal down, there was certainly plenty for Bassett to be optimistic about from their first half display.

But that seemed to wither away when an unfortunate defensive error from Kyle Lapham allowed Kieran Alder to grab Cinderford's second four minutes after the restart.

Minutes later, Drew then went close to a third as he was denied by Ellis after good set up play from goalscorer Davies.

Bassett began to chip away at their opponents though, and their confidence was restored when Gio Wrona whipped in a corner and TJ Bohane's bullet header guided the ball home to halve the deficit.

Thereafter, Bassett were on top, with the decision to throw caution to the wind by introducing forwards Jack Baker and Mark Francis to the game paying dividends.

Cinderford were on the ropes and eventually Bassett's pressure proved too much as Baker equalised with a low drive in the final minute of normal time.

That meant penalties and, like in the Extra Preliminary Round against Chipping Sodbury Town, Bassett went first.

The shootout started with eleven converted penalties Bohane, Alex Dinsmore, Chris Taylor, Sam Ockwell, Gio Wrona and Francis finding the net for Bassett.

The task then fell to Rhys Davies to prolong the drama further. But he was thwarted by an ice cool save from Ellis to keep the underdogs marching on.

#### Royal Wootton Bassett Town 1 Highworth Town 3

Royal Wootton Bassett Town's unbeaten home league record fell by the wayside as Highworth Town came from behind to record an emphatic 3-1 derby triumph at the Sustain Stadium.

With Bassett claiming ten points from the last twelve available to them and Highworth winning just one of their last five league games, Sam Collier's side - having played a game more - had opened up a healthy eight point gap over the Worthians heading into the fixture.

But that deficit was cut back as the visitors earned a season double while extending their league unbeaten run over Bassett to eight matches.

In truth it was a deserved triumph too, with Highworth by far the more creative and dangerous of the two sides throughout the match.

They had threatened early on when Sam Jepson did well to deny Dan Grieve as the forward shot on the turn.

Yet, despite the visitors being on top, Bassett found themselves ahead midway through the half courtesy of another stunning free kick from Jack Hobson-McVeigh.

Just four days after fizzing home a free kick against Longlevens, the New Zealander did it again as his 25 yard effort, assisted by the wind, flew past the wall and into the bottom right corner following a foul by former Bassett man Matt Cheetham.

That lead didn't last long though and Highworth were on terms ten minutes before the interval. Bassett failed to clear from a corner and, after a scramble, the ball broke to Grieve, who fired low into the bottom right corner from the edge of the box.

Forced to defend against the strong wind in the second half, Bassett then found themselves under significant Highworth pressure.

Having gone close from a corner shortly after the restart, it would be Cheetham who put his side ahead with a well-taken finish from a dangerous Rhys Wells set piece delivery on 65 minutes.

Wells then turned from provider to scorer to put Highworth firmly in control seven minutes later, producing an assured finish after collecting substitute Tom Wynn-Davies' cross-field pass and cutting inside.

Bassett's miserable league record against their rivals therefore continued. More importantly though in the context of this season, Collier and his team missed out on an opportunity to gain further ground on a rival playoff contender.

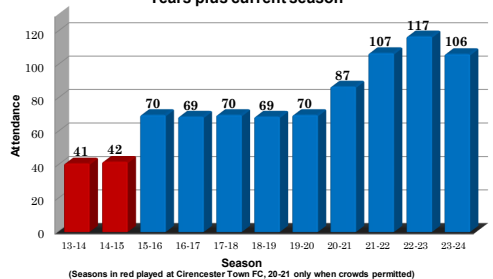

From Yeovil Town setting a new National League South record to Bury FC doing the same in the North West Counties League, thousands ticked through the turnstiles over the festive period.

Non-League football has seen a real boom in crowds in recent seasons.

Whether it's the product of post-covid where many fans discovered their local club or the increasing turn-off from VAR-powered top level football, it's been heartening to see such good attendances.

And it was no different on Boxing Day and New Year's Day – as well as in between – this season.

Credit to the excellent @NonLeagueCrowd account on X for a full rundown of who pulled in the big numbers – definitely worth a follow if social media is your thing.

On Boxing Day in the National League, 7,909 were at Roots Hall as Southend United ushered in a new era.

Contracts were exchanged on the takeover led by Australian businessman Justin Rees just a few days earlier. But Barnet spoil the party with a 2-0 win.

Aldershot Town welcomed their biggest crowd for 15 years for the local derby with Woking.

The travelling Cards made up 902 of the 5,970 crowd for the tense 0-0 encounter.

Yeovil Town set a new National League South high again, the 6,301 for their win over Taunton Town surpassing the 6,289 for October's midweek derby with Weymouth.

The next highest at Step 2 came in the National League North where 4,468 watched on as Scunthorpe United beat Farsley Celtic 2-0.

St Albans City claimed their second highest National League South attendance for their 2-1 defeat to Hemel Hempstead – 3,589 packing into Clarence Park on December

26.

At Step 3, Macclesfield Town's crowd boo continued with 4,201 watching a 0-0 draw with Hyde United.

Ramsgate are flying in Isthmian Division One South East – they beat Herne Bay 3-1 in front of a 1,625 crowd.

That was only topped at Step 4 by Mossley, who had 1,765 through the gate for their 2-0 victory against Stalybridge Celtic.

Runcorn Linnets also broke the 1,000 barrier – 1,001 saw them claim three points by beating promotion rivals Prescot Cables 2-1.

Bury FC made their welcome return to Gigg Lane this season and the crowds have rocketed ever since. They had 4,833 behind them for a win over Prestwich Heys.

There was even a four-figure gate in Step 6 on Boxing Day at Retford where 1,247 saw Retford United run out 4-1 winners.

It was a similar theme as we welcomed 2024.

Chesterfield are flying high at the top of the National League and are off to Watford this weekend in the FA Cup third round.

They had 8,898 for a thrilling 3-2 win over Solihull Moors on January 1.

And the Woking v Aldershot return saw 5,321 pack into Kingfield – this time there were goals, and a red card, as the Shots won 3-1.

York City's win over Gateshead topped 5,000 too, and there were 4,516 people for Hereford's 1-1 draw against Gloucester City.

Chatham Town have been on the rise again in recent seasons. Their opening Isthmian Premier win of the year – a 2-1 victory over Dulwich Hamlet – was witness by 2,588.

It's great to see so many enjoying their Non-League football.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town Development and Kintbury Rangers served up an eight goal thriller in the Wiltshire League Premier Division as Mark Simpkins' side claimed an impressive point against their title chasing opponents.

Kintbury were looking to close the gap to league leaders Amesbury Town to just two points at what would be the halfway point in the season for the two leading sides. But on a windy afternoon on the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground they would be frustrated in their quest as the two sides served up a goal fest that end all square.

With the wind behind them, it was the home side who went in front after a flick on from Flynn Walters from a Max Spackman throw found Kevin Lartey the wrong side of the Kintbury back line and he lobbed the advancing Charlie McCready from the right-hand side of the area.

Kintbury thought they had got back on level terms when a shot from captain Carl Jenner was saved by keeper Dan West, but George Armstrong was following up and put the ball away only to see the goal disallowed by an assistant referee's flag for offside.

# Wiltshire Premier Shield

### Tuesday 9th January v Swindon Supermarine (A)

While Royal Wootton Bassett Town continue their Hellenic League Premier Division playoff push, Sam Collier's side also have a Wiltshire Premier Shield semi final to look forward to next Tuesday (9 January) when they visit Swindon Supermarine. And the contest - a local derby pitting step three Marine against step five Bassett - at the Webbwood Stadium (7.45pm kick off) has all the ingredients to be a potential cup classic.

Bassett are no doubt underdogs against a Marine side who have put their early season struggles behind them and hit a good run of form as they seek to climb away from the Southern League Premier Division South danger zone. But Bassett will give everything they have got as they aim for a first cup final for the Men's First Team since the triumph in the 2000-01 Wiltshire Senior Cup. That appearance was 23 years ago. And it has been a similar amount of time - 22 years - since Bassett last met Supermarine in a competitive fixture.

The teams have faced one another in numerous friendlies while Bassett defeated Supermarine's Development side 3-0 in a

Hellenic League Floodlit Cup encounter in September. But the last time the clubs' first string sides squared off with something meaningful on the line was in a Premier Shield quarter final in December 2001.

Back then just one level separated the sides, with Marine in their first season of Southern League football after finishing as the 2000-01 Hellenic League Premier Division champions.

Playing in the Premier Shield for the first time in club history, Bassett had advanced to the last eight courtesy of a 1-0 first round victory against Bemerton Heath Harlequins in which Geoff Swatton scored the only goal of the game. And Swatton would play a decisive role in the quarter final against Supermarine, scoring a goal in each half as Pete Yeardeley's Bassett side pulled off a 2-0 upset victory on a fog strewn night at Rylands Way.

The teams now meet a round later (the stage Bassett lost at in 2001-02, when they bowed out after a 2-0 defeat against Swindon Town at the County Ground), with Bassett searching to spring another surprise.

Please do get along to the Webbwood Stadium to cheer the team on! Admission next Tuesday is £10 for adults, £6 for concessions (60+), £4 for youths (13-17) and free for those 12 and under.
